Position: International Procurement Expert (Part-Time)  
Duration: 12 Months over 3 years

The Royal Government of Cambodia (RGC) through the Ministry of Economy and Finance and the Ministry of Public Works and Transport (MPWT) has received financing from the World Bank toward the cost of the Road Connectivity Improvement Project, and intends to apply part of the proceeds for Consulting Services for Procurement of all packages of the Road Connectivity Improvement Project (RCIP).

MPWT is now seeking an experienced individual for the position of International Procurement Expert for RCIP (IPE-RCIP) to support the implementation of the RCIP by: (a) Ensuring compliance with the RCIP Project Documents, as approved; (b) Complying with the World Bank Procurement Regulations applicable to RCIP, including the New Procurement Framework and Regulations for Projects After July 2016; (c) Contributing for RCIP to meet the procurement objectives as defined under the Project Procurement Strategy for Development (PPSD); (d) Supervising the RCIP procurement activities to comply with the Standard Operating Procedures (SOP), for all Externally Financed Projects/Programs in Cambodia; and (e) Providing guidance to the National Procurement Expert, to the Procurement Assistant and to members of the Project Management Unit.

It is estimated that the services will require twelve (12) person-months of International Procurement Expert over 3 years with intermittent assignments. The MPWT now invites eligible individual Consultants to indicate their interest in providing the IPE-RCIP services. In order to qualify for this position, the candidates shall meet the following experience and competence requirements:

- i. At least Bachelor in procurement disciplines, management, economics, business administration, engineering or any related field; Post-Graduate level or Master Level preferred;
- ii. At least Seven (7) years of relevant procurement experience under multilateral funds over last 10 years;
- iii. At least Seven (7) years of experience as International Procurement Expert funds over last 10 years;
- iv. At least Five (5) years of experience in Public Procurement over last 7 years;
- v. At least Two (2) assignments in procurement/contracting Improvement Works for Roads/ Bridges
- vi. At least Two (2) assignments in procuring BOT contracts or PBC/OPBRC in road sector
- vii. Knowledge and/or familiar with the RGC Standard Operation Procedures on Procurement for Externally financed Projects/Programs in Cambodia, is an asset.
- viii. Knowledge of the World Bank Procurement Regulations for IPF Borrowers for Procurement in Investment Project Financing, Goods, Works, Non-consulting and Consulting Services, July 2016 is an advantage;

The Consultant will be selected in accordance with the World Bank Procurement Regulations for IPF Borrowers, July 2016, revised November 2017 and August 2018 edition, under Individual Consultants (IC) selection method. The attention of interested Consultants is drawn to paragraph 3.14, 3.16 and 3.17 of the said Regulations, setting forth the World Bank's policy on conflict of interest.
